RE: MUSD API/AYP 2009 Summary Statement

***Statements in regular text were made about the 2008 API/AYP. Statements in Bold are relative to the 2009 API/AYP results. Both are included for comparison purposes.**

- ✚ In 2008, 3 schools (New Haven, Veritas and Brock Elliott) are at or above 800!
- ✚ **In 2009, 6 schools (Brock Elliott, McParland, New Haven, Nile Garden, Stella Brockman, and Veritas are above 800!**

- ✚ In 2008, 20 out of 20 elementary schools are at 700 or above on API.
- ✚ **20 out of 20 elementary schools are at or above 749 on API.**

- ✚ 2 out of 4 high schools are at 700 or above on API.
- ✚ **In 2009, 2 out of 4 high schools are at 700 or above on the API and 2 are at 699 on the API.**

- ✚ In 2008, Komure experienced the most growth at 57 API points.
- ✚ **In 2009, Lincoln experienced the most growth at 47 API points.**

- ✚ In 2008, French Camp, our Restructured Program Improvement School, moved up 39 API points.
- ✚ **In 2009, French Camp, our Restructured Program Improvement School, moved up 23 API points and met all requirements to move out of Program Improvement!**

- ✚ In 2008, Weston Ranch HS moved up 37 API points.
- ✚ **In 2009, Sierra High moved up 36 API points.**

- ✚ In 2008, Sequoia is up 26 points.
- ✚ In 2008, Woodward is up 25 points.
- ✚ In 2008, Golden West is up 21 points.
- ✚ **In 2009, 16 of our 20 elementary schools made more than 20 points growth on the API.**

- ✚ In 2008, MUSD grew 8 API points to 731.
- ✚ **In 2009, MUSD grew 21 points to 752**

- ✚ In 2008, 15 schools met or exceeded their API growth targets.
- ✚ **In 2009, 24 schools met or exceeded their API growth targets.**

- ✚ In 2008, 15 schools also met their school-wide AYP growth targets.
- ✚ **In 2009, 21 schools also met their school-wide AYP growth targets.**

- ✚ In 2008, Eight MUSD schools met both school-wide and all sub-group growth targets this year: August Knodt, French Camp, Komure, Golden West, Joseph Widmer, Nile Garden, Veritas and Woodward.
- ✚ **In 2009, 21 schools met both school-wide AYP and all sub-group growth targets.**

We are very pleased with the consistent growth our District has experienced over the last 11 years on API. The strong growth made this past year is attributable directly to the focused, and dedicated staff and students who make up Manteca Unified.
